
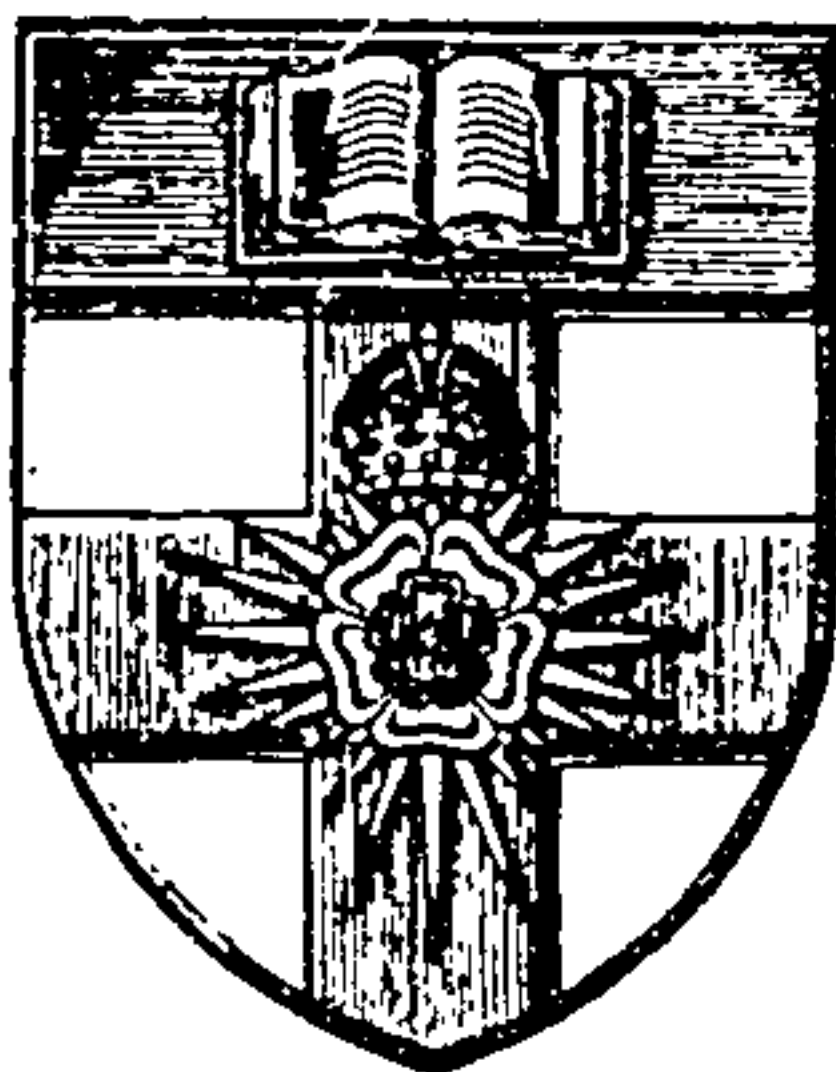

ADVERTISEMENT.

AFTER the many Essays on the Nature and Use of Money with which the Public have been *favoured*, I have, on this occasion, held any to be quite unnecessary; indeed, the subject, if I *mistake* not, appears so universally and well understood, that it is probable those who undertake it will never be thanked for their pains.

It cannot, however, be so with respect to Coins, because a knowledge of them and of their value is hardly to be obtained, most of the books and tables now extant being very erroneous.

That all possible exactness has, in this publication, been observed, I hope the Public will be convinced, when assured that the Engravings have been made from the best Impressions of the Coins themselves, collected at a great expense, and from some of the best cabinets in Europe. I have also assayed each by a double assay, and without regard to any printed estimate have calculated them severally by the Master's Report.

One table, however, I have annexed, because its authority is not to be questioned, and because it embraces a number of Coins which do not fall within the design of this work ; namely, those of very early date.

If it be objected that I have only given one side of each Coin, I answer, to have given both would only have increased the Price of the Book without adding to its utility, most of them having nothing more on the reverse than the Armorial Bearings, which form no part of my object;—to prevent the frauds which are practised by some, and the losses sustained by others, is all I have now in view.
